Chamber Welcomes Los Senderos Studio

Los Senderos Studio was founded in 2009. It is located halfway between Blanco and Johnson City on US Highway 281, on 36 acres of beautiful Hill Country Vistas.

Los Senderos is a small, professional-quality, all-digital recording studio running Pro Tools, the industry standard digital audio workstation. It has a nice collection of moderate to high-end microphones and a nice recording space. It caters to new and up-and-coming musicians and singer/songwriters, but also works with established artists looking for an easy-going atmosphere away from the hustle and bustle of the city. Musicians have come as far away as the Brownsville area to record here. The studio records music in many genres, including country, Americana, gospel, rock and blues. Los Senderos Studio offers a low-cost alternative to studios in Austin and San Antonio, keeping its rates about as low as can be found anywhere.

The studio handles the entire recording process, from tracking, to mixing and mastering. While some prefer to send their final mixes out to studios specializing in mastering, many musician, being on a budget, choose to have Los Senderos do it all.

The studio is owned and operated by Larry Seiler. A former businessman from Austin, Larry has had a long and varied career in several areas, but has had a love for the technical side of the music business most of his life. He began in high school by recording his own sound effects for the high school drama club. He was a disc jockey on two college campus radio stations and actually operated a rogue radio station from his dorm room while at the University of Texas. For many years, he recorded the live concerts of the Pasadena Philharmonic Orchestra.

The assistant engineer is Charlie Ewing. Charlie is a school teacher in the Marble Falls School district. He has been the drummer for several area bands, and frequently provides drumming services for clients when they come to the studio.



The studio is located on the ranch where Larry's parents once lived. When they passed away a few years ago, Larry and his wife Terri moved to the ranch from their home in Austin.
